Dear Sir,

In response to your letter of 21<sup>st</sup> Jan 2020,

To summarise, I raised the following concerns with your Department on November 4<sup>th</sup> 2019,

**. Evidence that proved WBUK were operating an illegal claims management business.**

Whilst I accept this is the remit of the FCA, I do not accept that your Department played no part in giving WBUK credence by engaging with them.

**. I asked you to provide a list of all contact between WBUK and officials or ministers at your Department and to confirm if any funding was given to WBUK.**

You have failed to provide this information and given no explanation as to why.

**. WBUK have publicly stated that they have met with over 40 senior officials at your Department, presumably these officials were being paid for the time they spent with WBUK and were acting in an official capacity. I asked why your Department would engage with such a dubious organisation, when you have consistently ignored comprehensively evidenced concerns from Compassion in Care for two decades?**

You have declined to comment on this at all.

. I asked you a number of other questions regarding information about WBUK tactics and funders (See attached letter) Page two and three. Please note the information referred to is public and you could easily have checked these facts prior to engaging with WBUK.

You have declined to answer any of these questions.

. I raised concerns that the Charity Protect, who were responsible for the pitiful PIDA and who are endorsing WBUK and are attempting to push through yet another version of a useless whistleblowing law.

"If a new bridge failed because of poor construction and design, would you consult those same designers to build a replacement bridge?" why are you doing the equivalent with Whistleblowing Law?

You have declined to respond on these issues.

I reminded you that,  
lives continue to be lost,  
that abuse and suffering has reached epidemic proportions  
that prescribed regulators under PIDA have consistently failed to act on whistle-blowers concerns.

That whistle-blowers from the last two decades have been completely failed by PIDA from the first case and that an \*acceptable inquiry into all this injustice must happen.

You have also declined to comment on any of the above.

Your latest letter highlights your only concern as being that, we have an expectation that you will investigate and respond to all the above.

Our expectation is entirely reasonable given all the circumstances, what you should be concerned about is failing to investigate such serious matters.

Finally I would also ask you to consider the culture and thought process that has led you to put in writing, that you are concerned that there is an expectation you will investigate and act on concerns that are clearly the remit of your department, when reported to you.
