In response to your email of 7th October, you **incorrectly** state that you are responding to my correspondence of August 20th, which was in fact one of a number of follow up letters I sent, asking why I had been waiting **5 months** for a response.

You have failed to respond to **any** of concerns I have raised, and I suggest you read the correspondence and reply to each of the questions put

You state that I have submitted FOI requests and suggest I re submit them, I will not, I expect the information requested to be provided and ask that you note that you have already exceeded all the time limits.

You state that the questions I have asked are directed at the Prime Minister and that the Department of Health cannot answer them, then why has this matter been referred to you by Downing Street?

You state in your email dated 7th October 2020 that “*ONS figures published, show deaths from COVID-19 in care homes are consistently falling*”

The ONS website that I am looking at says nothing of the sort, clarify what data you are relying on as it is of grave concern that you are unaware of what the current situation is.

Regarding PPE and the £600 million you refer to; these are **not** my questions and I refer you to my questions in the above correspondence.

You refer to testing capacity, this is clearly not happening, and I refer you to the questions I asked.

I expect the questions I asked to be answered in full, and the information requested to be provided.

I have waited 5 months for a response and the clock is still ticking.

I look forward to receiving a full response and please do not waste any more time avoiding the issues.

I would remind you that there is blatant discrimination against vulnerable elderly people, who have and continue to die in horrendous circumstances, their human rights denied as a matter of policy.
